

Behind the Scenes: (Here is what is happening!)

- ◆ Two teams have been formed to begin work on a Capital Campaign proposal. One group will focus on Building and Property, while the other group centers on Outreach options. Once these teams have narrowed down options they will get together, to draft several options for congregational reflection and feedback.
- ♦ Communion bread... Have you wondered what happens to the communion bread following worship? In the early church this bread was given to the children and elderly to eat. Message for the Evangelism Team

The Evangelism Team met on Sunday, April 10 - present were Heath Astrike, Susan McGovren, Pastor Jane Hillman and Mark Blackgrave.

A collection of articles on evangelism and volunteerism was shared prior to the meeting to help us focus on evangelism for Trinity. The definition of Evangelism can be simplified as "bringing people to God". As people of faith, Jesus gave us a goal to proclaim the Christian Gospel to the people world. Throughout the history of Trinity we have done evangelism in many different ways. As the society continues to change, we also must change on how we do evangelism in our church. There are many different ways for Trinity to do this.

We discussed several short term goals to be started or phased in prior to September of this year. First, each of the five standing ministries will be asked to look at their present programs and either revamp or add a new program that reaches out beyond our church's family. Second, we will create informational signage that fit the décor of the building, which give our worship times, a simple message, and a place for ministries to advertise their programs. Third, we will place small pamphlet in all the rooms used by the community. These small pamphlets will have information about our church. We also want to reinforce external communication regarding Trinity projects or programs to our community. This can be done by notifying local newspapers, community bulletin boards, local broadcast media, as well as our website and Facebook. We need to identify our self as Trinity UCC or Trinity United Church of Christ to avoid any possible confusion with Holy Trinity Catholic Schools.

The discussion then turned to intermediate goals (1 to 2 years) as well as our long-term goals. One of the items recommended was to review needs of the community to develop a plan that can be adopted by the congregation. Years ago, Trinity was known for the church that hosted a Thanksgiving dinner - this would be an example of the type of projects that we are seeking. We want to create a warm friendly feeling when people think of Trinity United Church of Christ. If you have an ideas on projects tell one of the team members.

Our next meeting will be held Sunday, July 24, 2016 at 11:30 am, we welcome new members.

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE - INCREASE MORE

"There are those who (generously) scatter abroad, and yet increase more; there are those who withhold more than is fitting or what is justly due, but it results only in want." (Proverbs 11:24, AMP)

In the book of Genesis, God set up a system of seedtime and harvest. Everything God does starts with a seed. The Bible also tells us that God gives seed to the sower. In other words, if you are a person who has a desire to bless others and sow seed, God will make sure you have plenty to give. Notice in today's verse what happens when we generously sow seed — we increase more! Just like planting a seed in the natural brings an abundant harvest, planting a spiritual seed brings an abundant harvest as well. You can't out give God! The scripture says that God will pour out blessings on you that you can barely contain.
