### **God's Home Improvement News!**

Look at the board in the foyer for **project progress! GHI envelopes** may also be found on this board.

The roller coaster ride of weather this spring has caused some delays in the Circle Drive and Sanctuary window tinting projects.

- For the Circle Drive, surveyors have done the field work for the topographic survey already and should have it drawn up by April 20. Then Cash-Waggner will create the construction plans from the design. We had hoped to have the survey sooner, but with all the recent rain the crews were set back a couple of weeks. Meanwhile, the Trinity Art Committee has been busy creating conceptual design options for the canopy to incorporate into the bid.
  - Remember: Once a plan with bids is determined, a congregational meeting will be called to vote on the project and funding.
- For the **Tinted Windows**, we simply need some good weather for our contractor to get on the roof to gain accurate measurements for the film to be ordered. Thanks everyone for their contributions and patience.

The Property Team has identified some repairs that have to be done. While we were investigating a leak, we found that two windows on the second floor do not close. These are located in the confirmation and the preschool-kindergarten classrooms. They are sagging and the framing around the window has failed. This probably means 2 new windows. There are also plaster issues on the second floor that are beyond what we can do on our


