May 2019

*"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,  
baptizing them in the name of  
the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit,  
and teaching them to everything  
that I have commanded you.*

Matthew 28: 19-20*

**There was one more surprise that came up – something we hadn't considered.** Once the lines for the parking spaces were painted on the surface, we realized that during the planning process, there wasn't an allowance made at each end of the line of parking spaces for people to exit vehicles. The bible tells us Jesus walked on water, but we need to make sure if you park in our specialty parking lot, you have a solid surface to walk on! The goal is to have this completed sometime before the end of May, weather permitting. When this concrete section is poured, it will close the space designated for visitor parking at the end of the lot for at least two weeks. (See the diagram below.)
