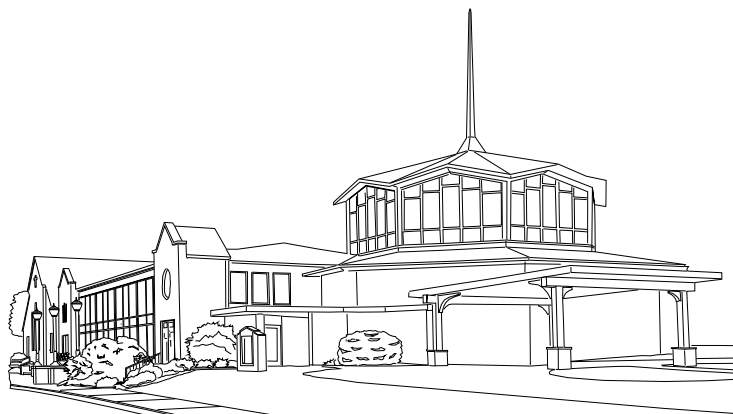

OUTREACH COMMITTEE



The Outreach Committee chose **Mentors for Youth** for the **Lenten Project** which Trinity UCC will sponsor this year. **Ellen Corn, Executive Director of Mentors for Youth**, spoke at both the 8:00 and the 10:15 services on Sunday, February 23.

She explained to us how we can help children and youth ages 6-14 in our area who do not have a "naturally occurring" mentor in their lives. She gave examples of how difficult life can be for these children. Most of us can imagine when there is a lack of guidance in a young person's life, there may be less success in their future. This can affect the community as well.

Jesus instructed us to help each other. **Our goal for Mentors for Youth is \$5,000.**

Maybe one of us will become a mentor as well.

FOOD BANK SUNDAY, MARCH 1

March 1 is Food Bank Sunday. That does not mean the **only Sunday** you can bring food to church for the Food Bank is March 1. If you **forgot**, or if you **have extra funds**, you can bring your donations of **tuna and or hamburger helper** to Trinity any Sunday (or *other day*) during **March**.



Food is placed on the altar in the wicker baskets the **first Sunday of the month**. After that it can be placed in the plastic bins marked "**Food Bank**" in the foyer.

The February donations of *pasta and spaghetti sauce* to the Community Food Bank is a blessing. We **collected 24 pasta , 23 spaghetti sauce and a jar of jelly**.

How does the Community Food Bank Work?

Some of you may not be familiar with how the Food Bank works. People/families who come to the Food Bank asking for assistance fill out a shopping list. Some items are always on there each week; some change. It depends on what is available. They might have a choice of breakfast bars, cereal, or oatmeal.

They also list the ages of the members of the family. A can or box tells you how many servings it contains. A family of two adults and 3 young children would be given 1 can or box that says: "serves 4." A family of 2 adults and 3 teenagers *might* get 2 cans, depending on the quantity on the shelves. Each of your donations is important. **Thank you!**

In **April** we will be collecting **canned vegetables**.

We are in need of **individually wrapped Easter candy** for our Easter Egg Hunt which will be on Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020, following the late service.

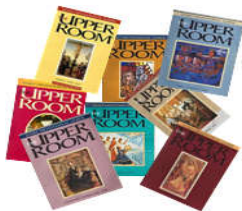

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS FOR FEBRUARY

Approved the interim pastor who will serve Trinity church during Pastor Jane's sabbatical.

Approved to suspend Pastor Jane's 2020 evaluation in lieu of her time off on sabbatical.

Approved per Congregation Annual meeting request to transfer GHI account money as directed to the maintenance fund. It was agreed to leave a small amount of money in the bank account to keep it open.

Quick notes:

Our church's constitution along with Pastor Jane's call papers allow for a three month sabbatical after six years as our pastor.

Pastor Jane is scheduled to begin her sabbatical in May. Her last Sunday will be on May 17. She will return to worship on August 23. We have been blessed with her leadership and guidance for the last seven years.

We also have been blessed with a minister who will step in as our Interim Pastor during Pastor Jane's absence. Council is still working out the details; however, we hope to be able to share more with you in the next couple of weeks.

PASTORAL RELATIONS TEAM

As plans have begun for Pastor Jane's Sabbatical this summer, the Pastoral Relations team thought it was important to communicate why and what a Pastoral Sabbatical is, as it's been a long time since we've gone through one as a congregation.

Per our church's constitution, called pastors are entitled to three month's sabbatical every six years of service. Since last year was a confirmation cycle, Pastor Jane opted to postpone hers until this summer. Please note, Pastor Jane will be discussing details of her sabbatical as it draws nearer.

A little bit about Pastoral Sabbaticals: Jesus frequently left his followers and disciples to pray by himself, spending time reflecting on his call, listening to God's voice, and receiving strength and direction for his ongoing ministry. God commanded the people to let the land lie fallow every seven years to replenish itself (Leviticus 25:1-5).

A sabbatical allows a pastor to refocus their ministry. It contributes to a pastor's spiritual growth. Being intentional about personal spiritual growth is difficult when a minister is constantly involved in the spiritual lives of others. In the same sentiment, it prevents burnout. People in "helping professions" can burn out, in part, because of that constant, intimate involvement in the emotional burdens of others.

We also hope it will encourage new patterns for work and self-care and that Pastor Jane will be able to put herself and her health first for a few months.

A committee and council was tasked with and found an Interim Sabbatical Pastor to handle services and Pastoral Care. Other members have stepped up to handle administrative duties as well. We welcome and questions or concerns.
