



Children's Sabbath - Sunday, October 11, 2020

World Communion: World Communion Sunday offers congregations a distinctive opportunity to experience Holy Communion in the context of the global community of faith. The first Sunday of October has become a time when Christians in every culture break bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the Head of the Church. On that day, they remember that they are part of the whole body of believers. Whether shared in a grand cathedral, a mud hut, outside on a hilltop, in a meetinghouse, or in a storefront, Christians celebrate the communion liturgy in as many ways as there are congregations. World Communion Sunday can be both a profound worship experience and a time for learning more about our wider community of faith.

Children's Sabbath: "Reimagining Our Future with Children, Justice, and Joy"

From Marian Wright Edelman - Children's Defense Fund...

If we love America and love our children, you and I must build a powerful movement to end child poverty and transform the political and economic priorities in a nation that has ignored the cries of millions of poor children to stack the decks in favor of a few exceedingly rich and powerful billionaires and millionaires. We must envision and realize an America where every child has enough—enough time, attention and stability from parents and other caring adults; and enough quality education, healthy food, stable shelter, accessible health care and other basics we who are more privileged want for our own children. God did not make two classes of children and we do so at our peril. Let us commit together to making this Children's Sabbath a galvanizing weekend that amplifies our shared moral vision for an end to child poverty. Let it unite our hearts and reaffirm our commitments to making a difference. May it inspire, inform, motivate and sustain us throughout the year to do all we can to level the playing field for all children entrusted to our care.

Worship Notes for Parents:

Approval of Operating Budget for 2021

Update on the Kitchen Refrigerator [It's presently working but will eventually need to be replaced.]


Approved increase in the Outreach Assistance Fund

Fellow Member in Christ,

- Part of our September Council meeting was spent discussing the Operating Budget. All agreed there are some difficulties in planning for 2021, considering the impact the current Covid pandemic is having on the church as a whole. As reported last month, giving is down but so are expenses, which is good. However, our planning for 2021 needs to incorporate the potential we could return to normalcy in church attendance, activities and work. We have some cash reserves to weather this storm, but you will notice in the attached Operating Budget for 2021 that we have a larger deficit than normal. Taking all these variables into consideration, this can be a bit overwhelming. So please contact a council member should you have any questions regarding this proposed budget. As in the past, the rationale will be explained in a Budget Presentation Meeting in October.
- As many of you know, the kitchen refrigerator is 20+ years old and parts for repairs are no longer available. It is currently cooling again, but sometime soon we may need to replace this unit. We've done some research and are looking at a possible \$3,500+ expense. In the meantime, we are routinely checking the refrigerator to ensure it continues to maintain the proper cooling temperature.
- A request has been made by the Outreach Assistance Team for an additional \$2,500 to be transferred into their
 operating account. During this current pandemic, many people in our community are experiencing financial
 issues and are in need of help to pay their rent or utilities. Consequently, we are experiencing an increase in
 requests for assistance. This additional money will enable continuation of this help through the end of the year.

We continue to worship in-person Sunday mornings with our face masks on and smiles unseen. Many volunteers have worked diligently to provide a safe environment for those attending our worship services. For our church family members who feel safer at home, as well as those attending in-person worship, we want to be there for you; so please let us know how we might better assist you in your current faith journey.
