Lent 2022 "Let Go of the Old - BEHOLD, A New Thing Comes!"

Jesus said:

No one patches old clothes by sewing on a piece of new cloth.
 The new piece would shrink and tear a bigger hole.

 No one pours new wine into old wineskins. The wine would swell and burst the old skins.
 Then the wine would be lost, and the skins would be ruined.
 New wine must be put into new wineskins.

Mark 2: 21-22

Ash Wednesday, which is March 2, begins our Lenten Journey. This year we are encouraged to let go of the "Old" that weighs heavily upon our hearts. Jesus gives us the strength to let go of sins, mistakes, regrets, old grudges, bad habits and unhealthy relationships. Jesus said: "New wine must be put into new wineskins." This is also true for a butterfly that must shed the confines of the cocoon in order to fly free. Likewise, the stone is rolled back so that Jesus might rise from the dead. In faith, we trust in the promise of Jesus to make all things new. Joy comes in the midst of sorrow; hope comes when despair surrounds us; grace comes and fills our hearts with unconditional and extravagant love.

Yes, things are changing. The world around us is not the same as when we were younger. The challenges are not less; rather they are just different. **BUT>>> life goes on in the midst of change.** New life, new possibilities await us at the empty tomb. So, this Lenten season, consider letting go of at least one piece of "the old" and embrace the promise of new life.

Please bring your family and join me on Ash Wednesday at 7:00 PM in the sanctuary. As you enter you will be invited to select a rugged rock to hold in your hand during worship. At the time of confession, we all will have a chance to exchange this rugged rock for a keychain with three smooth stones. These stones are to remind us that God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit will guide us on the path that is before us with an abundance of grace. No, it will not be a straight or familiar path but we shall not fear for God will be our guide. Blessed ashes will be available for individual use; the ash is a reminder to "repent and believe in the Gospel"!

Together we shall wait for the blooming of love to wash over our old selves and clothe us in new life. Together we shall proclaim to the world: "Behold, a New Thing Comes!".

This year the Outreach Team, with the approval of the Church Council, has selected a **local organization for the Lenten Mission.** Members of the Outreach Team became aware that the local **Habitat for Humanity** was building a home in Huntingburg, and

that this home would be for **Becky Mennerick Armstrong.** There was a story in The Herald this past fall explaining that Becky, her husband, and their two children were the people chosen to live in the house which is currently being built by Habitat volunteers. Becky and her family are also required to help with the building of the home. The story explained how deserving the family was. Since Becky's father was the minister at Trinity for many years, and her mother taught preschool at Trinity Tree House during that time, the Outreach Committee felt it was appropriate to select them as the recipients of our Lenten Mission donations.

Habitat for Humanity's local board president was contacted and assured us that any money collected will definitely go directly to the house being built for this family. The house should be finished about the end of this school year. The Habitat board president said our donation would be especially appreciated at a time when many things would be being purchased to finish the home.

Habitat's local board president, Steve Whelan, will be speaking at both services on March 13th. He will present slides on our TVs showing the progress of Becky and Eddy Armstrong's home, explain how Habitat works, and answer questions you may have.

We on the Outreach Team feel there are several of you who will remember the Mennericks and want to help their "child." We hope others of you who do not remember or have connections to the Mennericks, will just want to bless a deserving family by donating so they can have their own home.

Last year, Trinity donated more than the goal of \$5,000 to Water for South Sudan. Hopefully this year we will also reach more than that goal of \$5,000 for the **home of Becky and Eddy Armstrong and their children**.
